





## AASAI's project—Deena Seva Blooms with 10 Children HELP FOR STREET CHILDREN IN BANGALORE

You have been generously contributing to our project, Deena Seva Sangha (DSS) in Bangalore. DSS started in the year 1930 by Gandhian workers, provide education, and rehabilitation to over 20,000 orphan and destitute children in the slums of Bangalore. DSS programs include several schools including school for special needs children, and vocational training centers. AASAI pro-actively interacts with the city police to shelter abandoned children who would otherwise be in city jails. Buoyed by our success, AASAI now has expanded its effort and has taken charge of ten children (previously five children) who are now housed in 3 cottages in the DSS-owned 90 acres of land in Pestalozzi Village near Bangalore. While in India, recently Dr. Gopinath visited DSS to see the progress and to determine what else could be done. He learned that

with a buy-back arrangement. AASAI plans to initiate a project at the Pestallozi Village to grow herbs for the drug company. We believe that this would be a valuable learning experience for the children and the village residents. The funds generated will be fully used to support the street

children educational activities.

Thanks to your support, Pushpa, a 10 year old adorable girl, abandoned by

mother and grandmother, abused by an alcoholic father, now is growing nicely and studying in 1st grade. 13 year old Uma, another child, abandoned by her parents, with no place to go is currently studying

5th grade. A special teacher assigned to her is bringing her into the mainstream. AASAI is proud of DSS's accomplishments and hope these precious children will become bright and productive future citizens. We thank you for your continued support of this valuable project.

#### AASAI'S NEW PROJECT—BALAVIDYALAYA—TEACHER TRAINING FOR HEARING AND SPEECH IMPAIRED CHILDREN

Thanks to our fiend and Muralidharan, AASAI has initiated support to the Balavidyalaya School For Young Deaf Children, Chennai. Parents often do not realize that unless children hear, they will not talk and become speech-impaired as well. Often doctors do a poor job of not communicating with the parents regarding the importance of the first three years in acquiring verbal skills. "Catch them young" says the honorary principal, Ms. Sarswathi Narayanswamy, She is confident that through early intervention, parental commitment, and social support, these chil-

dren could be seamlessly inte-AASAI director Rajamani grated into the mainstream. As if to the prove the point, Rajesh an alumni of the school, was awarded the most valuable professional by the Microsoft company for the third consecutive years. This year three alumni of the school has joined the engineering school in Chennai.

Established in 1969, the school has currently 180 children including a 48-day old child. The school has formulated a unique and nonconventional methodology but thoroughly tested to be effective in child development, DHVANI (Development of hearing voice and natural integration). The approach uses early education, best teaching practices, like Montessori, and Play way to teach the children listening skills without relying on "speech reading" the

teacher. Through specialized equipment, and teaching aids suited for young children, they are trained to make best use of their residual hearing and learn to talk, without the use of sign language. With a mission to take this technol-**^^^^** ogy across the nation, Balavidyalaya Institute Of Teacher Training was born in ☆ June 2001 and is conducting a ☆ Diploma In Teaching Young 🌣 Hearing Impaired (DTYHI) tc☆ produce qualified teachers in this area. This Diploma is the first of its kind. The trainees pay no fees though its costs the school Rs. 35,000 a year. AASAI is proud to sponsor ☆ two trainees this year. Hope you will find it in your generous heart to support this pro-☆ ject even more.

#### SALUTE TO LITTLE ANGEL SCHOOL - FOR ITS DEDICATED SERVICE TO SPECIAL NEEDS CHILDREN

#### A STORY OF SELF RELIANCE AND SUNSHINE

Thanks to AASAI's support, Little Angles School has renovated three rooms and a bathroom to provide better learning atmosphere for children with multiple disabilities. In addition, during 2004, AASAI increased its support and commitment to Little Angles by sponsoring school fee for seven children who's parent cannot afford to send them to school. Little Angels was founded in 2002 by a former flight attendant, Jahangir Afshari. The school's primary focus is to meet the challenges posed to young children with multiple disabilities. Independence, confidence, and education are the main goals of the organization.

Little Angels encourages the Indian society to accept and help these little angels to bloom. Children are taught communication, pre-reading and writing skills, and tolerance. Occupational and speech therapists, and to fight their problems on a daily basis. Besides regular education courses, the children are taken for nature walks, trips to beaches and parks, and swimming lessons. Little Angles School does not have its own facility and started with two rented rooms from the Bombay

psychiatrists help students Municipal Corporation – all 40 students were cramped into two rooms with no room for growth. In 2003, with great difficulty, the school obtained additional three rooms and a bathroom from the Municipality. The rooms and bathroom were in bad shape and needed extensive renovation. Thanks to your support, the

rooms have been renovated and the little angles have a better learning environment.

#### DR. DAVE MUELLER - AN ARDENT SUPPORTER OF OUR WORK IN INDIA By L. Raghavan—Chairman

"Thy will be done" says Jesus... When one is involved in selfless service to mankind. mysterious things happen; unforeseen divine force gathers momentum; brings the world around you come together to help you...One such great soul is free education in English to the our own dear friend Mr. V. Swaminthan, IAAS (retd), known as Swami to friends. After years of distinguished government service Swami, a selfless visionary, has tirelessly devoted every waking moment of his life to the cause of the old, needy and children education. Under the aegis of Sri Ramani Ranganayaki Trust, and Sri Poorna Mahameru Trusts through AASAI. Trust, Swami started "Sri Vidyasram" free school to village children and "Shanti Niwas" home for destitute senior citizen.

When one is as devoted as Swami is, you find that there is less tape to measure the gap between you and others.....you discover that your cause is at the center of the universe. Distances, national origin or other factors vanish...there is only "wholeness." You wonder whether this is all true. Yes... here is the real life proof.

Dr. Muller earned his PhD from the prestigious MIT. While holding several senior management positions at Shell Oil and Chevron Chemical Companies, Dr. Mueller visited India more than 30 times. Here comes the divine intervention. During this period, he became close friends with Swami who was also working at Chevron as a senior executive, after retirement. In their wide ranging 'off hours conversations' Dr. Mueller learned of and visited Shanti Niwas. bringing cheers to the elders. He also learned about Swami's plans to found Sri Vidyasram to provide high quality, poor in the remote village in Tamil Nadu. Upon retirement, Dr. Mueller the "multitasked" was not idling away his time but rather pursued his interest in home renovation projects. Since 2003, his handiwork skills have been adapted to a novel form of support and has generated more than \$17,000 for Swami's two



In Dr. Mueller's words.... "My growing retirement interest in home handiwork was well known to my friends to the point exercise. The bonus is to be they frequently asked me to help them in the planning of small projects which they intended to have contractors do in their homes. I would often say something like, 'You don't need a contractor...you and I can do it,' to which I would get a polite reply, 'Thanks but we really wouldn't feel right about taking up your time.' These were interesting projects to me, to the point that I actually was exasperated with feelings of being

"deprived" on a couple of occasions. In early 2003, a good friend, Vinnie Woldanski, needed some small exterior water damage items repaired. A contractor had quoted a ridiculously high price and Vinnie asked me to look at the situation to determine if it was 'fair value'. I told Vinnie that I would be delighted to do the work myself (it looked like fun) and he could make a donation to my favorite charity .. Swami's ashram... if he was worried about using my time. Vinnie liked the idea, so we did the work, and Vinnie donated \$300 to Sri Vidvasram, still saving significantly from the contractor's quotation. The same motif worked with other friends, and "business" developed quickly by word of mouth to the point that I have more Swami projects in hand than the time to do them. Along the way, Vinnie has become a reliable "apprentice", helping me on several of our larger renovation projects. These projects are great fun and good able to help friends and involve them in supporting Swami's good works in India through AASAI."

From AASAI's family, 130 school children at Srividvasram and 60 elders at Shanti Niwas.... our sincere thanks, love, and prayers and blessings to Dr. Mueller his family and his extended family of friends. These are not the mere words of mortals but rather feelings of immortal souls.

In addition, the school provides vocational training to women enabling them to maintain their dignity and economic independence. The school provides free balanced lunch for poor children shelter for destitute and poor . AASAI is supporting the school's midday meal program.

Sri Vidyasram school is bringing top notch education comparable to any school that privileged ones attend to village children. The school imparts, besides regular curriculum, physical exercises, meditation, prayer in a state of the art facility. The school provides uniform and all school supplies. The school also provides free midday meals. The school started in 2001 now boasts 130 students in the grades from kinder garden through 2nd grades. AASAI is proud of this project's accomplishments.


## AASAI CHILDREN WITH OUR DIRECTOR DR. GOPINATH


